Jonah Chapter 3 – Nineveh

Jonah, the reluctant and rebellious prophet finally arrives at that great city of Nineveh. For three days he walks through the city preaching repentance and judgment to come. Rabbi's taught that his voice could be heard throughout the city. Conviction and repentance was almost immediate. Something was going on here that was not the normal response to preaching. God was at work.

"Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and cry against it; for their wickedness is come up before me." – Jonah 1:2

Chapter 3 (NIV)

1 Then the word of the LORD came to Jonah <u>a second time</u>: 2 "Go to the great city of Nineveh and <u>proclaim</u> to it the message I give you." 3 Jonah obeyed the word of the LORD and went to Nineveh. Now Nineveh was a <u>very important city</u>--a visit required three days. 4 <u>On the first day</u>, Jonah started into the city. He proclaimed: "Forty more days and Nineveh will be overturned."

5 The Ninevites believed God. They declared a fast, and all of them, from the greatest to the least, put on sackcloth. 6 When the news reached the king of Nineveh, he rose from his throne, took off his royal robes, covered himself with **sackcloth** and sat down in the dust. 7 Then he issued a proclamation in Nineveh: "By the decree of the king and his nobles: Do not let any man or beast, herd or flock, taste anything; do not let them eat or drink. 8 But let man and beast be covered with sackcloth. Let everyone call urgently on God. Let them give up their evil ways and their violence.

9 Who knows? God may yet relent and with compassion turn from his fierce anger so that we will not perish." 10 When God saw what they did and how they turned from their evil ways, he had compassion and did not bring upon them the destruction he had threatened.

KEY HEBREW WORDS TO UNDERSTAND

The words marked in bold followed by a number indicates the Hebrew number to the word as organized by Strong in Strong's Concordance. Using a computer program or an online program you can click on that number and see the definition and use of that word in Hebrew and elsewhere in the Bible.

- 1 And the word of the LORD came unto Jonah the second time, saying,
- 2 <u>Arise</u> <06965>, <u>go</u> <03212> unto Nineveh, that <u>great</u> <01419> city, and <u>preach</u> <07121> unto it the <u>preaching</u> <07150> that I <u>bid</u> <01696> you.
- 3 So Jonah <u>arose</u> <06965>, and went unto Nineveh, according to the word of the LORD. Now Nineveh was an <u>exceeding</u> <0430> <u>great</u> <01419> city of three days' journey.
- 4 And Jonah began to enter into the city a day's journey, and he <u>cried</u> <07121>, and said, Yet forty days, and Nineveh shall be <u>overthrown</u> <02015>.
- 5 So the people of Nineveh <u>believed</u> <0539> God, and proclaimed a fast, and put on <u>sackcloth</u> <08242> from the greatest of them even to the least of them.
- 6 For word came unto the king of Nineveh, and he <u>arose</u> <06965> from his throne and he <u>laid</u> <05674> his robe from him, and <u>covered</u> <03680>) *him* with <u>sackcloth</u> <08242>, and sat in ashes.
- 7 And he caused *it* to be **proclaimed** <02199> and **published** <0559> through Nineveh by the decree of the king and his nobles, saying, Let neither man nor beast, herd nor flock, taste any thing: let them not feed, nor drink water:
- 8 But let man and beast be covered with <u>sackcloth</u> <08242>, and <u>cry</u> <07121> mightily unto God, yea, let them <u>turn</u> <07725> every one from his <u>evil way</u> <01870>, and from the <u>violence</u> <02555> that *is* in their hands.
- 9 Who can tell *if* God will <u>turn</u> <07725> and <u>repent</u> <05162> and <u>turn away</u> <07725> from his fierce anger that we <u>perish</u> <06> not?
- 10 And God saw their works <04639>, that they <u>turned</u> <07725> from their <u>evil</u> <07451> <u>way</u> <01870>; and God <u>repented</u> <05162> of the <u>evil</u> <07451>, that he had said that he would do unto them; and he did it not.
