WORD STUDY

Forgive, forgiven, forgiveness

- Matthew 6:12 And <u>forgive</u> us our debts, as we <u>forgive</u> our debtors.
- Matthew 6:14 For if ye <u>forgive</u> men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also <u>forgive</u> you:
- Matthew 6:15 But if ye <u>forgive</u> not men their trespasses, neither will your Father <u>forgive</u> your trespasses.
- Matthew 9:6 But that ye may know that the Son of man hath power on earth to <u>forgive</u> sins, (then saith he to the sick of the palsy,) Arise, take up thy bed, and go unto thine house.
- Matthew 18:21 ¶ Then came Peter to him, and said, Lord, how oft shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? till seven times?
- Matthew 18:35 So likewise shall my heavenly Father do also unto you, if ye from your hearts <u>forgive</u> not every one his brother their trespasses.
- Mark 2:7 Why doth this *man* thus speak blasphemies? who can forgive sins but God only?
- Mark 2:10 But that ye may know that the Son of man hath power on earth to <u>forgive</u> sins, (he saith to the sick of the palsy,)
- Mark 11:25 And when ye stand praying, <u>forgive</u>, if ye have ought against any: that your Father also which is in heaven may <u>forgive</u> you your trespasses.
- Mark 11:26 But if ye do not <u>forgive</u>, neither will your Father which is in heaven <u>forgive</u> your trespasses.
- Luke 5:21 And the scribes and the Pharisees began to reason, saying, Who is this which speaketh blasphemies? Who can <u>forgive</u> sins, but God alone?
- Luke 5:24 But that ye may know that the Son of man hath power upon earth to <u>forgive</u> sins, (he said unto the sick of the palsy,) I say unto thee, Arise, and take up thy couch, and go into thine house.
- Luke 6:37 ¶ Judge not, and ye shall not be judged: condemn not, and ye shall not be condemned: <u>forgive</u>, and ye shall be forgiven:
- Luke 11:4 And <u>forgive</u> us our sins; for we also <u>forgive</u> every one that is indebted to us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil.
- Luke 17:3 Take heed to yourselves: If thy brother trespass against thee, rebuke him; and if he repent, forgive him.
- Luke 17:4 And if he trespass against thee seven times in a day, and seven times in a day turn again to thee, saying, I repent; thou shalt forgive him.
- Luke 23:34 Then said Jesus, Father, <u>forgive</u> them; for they know not what they do. And they parted his raiment, and cast lots.
- 2 Corinthians 2:7 So that contrariwise ye *ought* rather to <u>forgive</u> *him*, and comfort *him*, lest perhaps such a one should be swallowed up with overmuch sorrow.
- 2 Corinthians 2:10 To whom ye <u>forgive</u> any thing, I <u>forgive</u> also: for if I forgave any thing, to whom I forgave *it*, for your sakes *forgave I it* in the person of Christ;
- 2 Corinthians 12:13 For what is it wherein ye were inferior to other churches, except *it be* that I myself was not burdensome to you? <u>forgive</u> me this wrong.
- 1 John 1:9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to <u>forgive</u> us *our* sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Forgiveness

- Mark 3:29 But he that shall blaspheme against the Holy Ghost hath never <u>forgiveness</u>, but is in danger of eternal damnation:
- Acts 5:31 Him hath God exalted with his right hand *to be* a Prince and a Saviour, for to give repentance to Israel, and <u>forgiveness</u> of sins.
- Acts 13:38 Be it known unto you therefore, men *and* brethren, that through this man is preached unto you the <u>forgiveness</u> of sins:
- Acts 26:18 To open their eyes, *and* to turn *them* from darkness to light, and *from* the power of Satan unto God, that they may receive <u>forgiveness</u> of sins, and inheritance among them which are sanctified by faith that is in me.
- Ephesians 1:7 In whom we have redemption through his blood, the <u>forgiveness</u> of sins, according to the riches of his grace;
- Colossians 1:14 In whom we have redemption through his blood, even the <u>forgiveness</u> of sins:

Forgiven

- Matthew 9:2 And, behold, they brought to him a man sick of the palsy, lying on a bed: and Jesus seeing their faith said unto the sick of the palsy; Son, be of good cheer; thy sins be <u>forgiven</u> thee.
- Matthew 9:5 For whether is easier, to say, *Thy* sins be <u>forgiven</u> thee; or to say, Arise, and walk? Matthew 12:31 Wherefore I say unto you, All manner of sin and blasphemy shall be <u>forgiven</u> unto men: but the blasphemy *against* the *Holy* Ghost shall not be forgiven unto men.
- Matthew 12:32 And whosoever speaketh a word against the Son of man, it shall be <u>forgiven</u> him: but whosoever speaketh against the Holy Ghost, it shall not be <u>forgiven</u> him, neither in this world, neither in the *world* to come.
- Mark 2:5 When Jesus saw their faith, he said unto the sick of the palsy, Son, thy sins be <u>forgiven</u> thee.
- Mark 2:9 Whether is it easier to say to the sick of the palsy, *Thy* sins be <u>forgiven</u> thee; or to say, Arise, and take up thy bed, and walk?
- Mark 3:28 Verily I say unto you, All sins shall be <u>forgiven</u> unto the sons of men, and blasphemies wherewith soever they shall blaspheme:
- Mark 4:12 That seeing they may see, and not perceive; and hearing they may hear, and not understand; lest at any time they should be converted, and *their* sins should be <u>forgiven</u> them.
- Luke 5:20 And when he saw their faith, he said unto him, Man, thy sins are forgiven thee.
- Luke 5:23 Whether is easier, to say, Thy sins be forgiven thee; or to say, Rise up and walk?
- Luke 6:37 ¶ Judge not, and ye shall not be judged: condemn not, and ye shall not be condemned: forgive, and ye shall be <u>forgiven</u>:
- Luke 7:47 Wherefore I say unto thee, Her sins, which are many, are <u>forgiven</u>; for she loved much: but to whom little is <u>forgiven</u>, *the same* loveth little.
- Luke 7:48 And he said unto her, Thy sins are forgiven.
- Luke 12:10 And whosoever shall speak a word against the Son of man, it shall be <u>forgiven</u> him: but unto him that blasphemeth against the Holy Ghost it shall not be <u>forgiven</u>.
- Acts 8:22 Repent therefore of this thy wickedness, and pray God, if perhaps the thought of thine heart may be <u>forgiven</u> thee.
- Romans 4:7 *Saying*, Blessed *are* they whose iniquities are <u>forgiven</u>, and whose sins are covered. Ephesians 4:32 And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you.
- Colossians 2:13 And you, being dead in your sins and the uncircumcision of your flesh, hath he quickened together with him, having <u>forgiven</u> you all trespasses;
- James 5:15 And the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up; and if he have committed sins, they shall be <u>forgiven</u> him.
- 1 John 2:12 I write unto you, little children, because your sins are <u>forgiven</u> you for his name's sake.
