## **Key References to Understanding Repentance**

Acts 11:18 NIV — When they heard this, they had no further objections and praised God, saying, "So then, even to Gentiles God has granted repentance that leads to life."

Acts 20:21 NIV — I have declared to both Jews and Greeks that they must turn to God in repentance and have faith in our Lord Jesus.

Acts 26:20 NIV — First to those in Damascus, then to those in Jerusalem and in all Judea, and then to the Gentiles, I preached that they should repent and turn to God and demonstrate their repentance by their deeds.

Romans 2:4 NIV — Or do you show contempt for the riches of his kindness, forbearance and patience, not realizing that God's kindness is intended to lead you to repentance?

- 2 Corinthians 7:9 NIV yet now I am happy, not because you were made sorry, but because your sorrow led you to repentance. For you became sorrowful as God intended and so were not harmed in any way by us.
- 2 Corinthians 7:10 NIV Godly sorrow brings repentance that leads to salvation and leaves no regret, but worldly sorrow brings death.
- 2 Timothy 2:25 NIV Opponents must be gently instructed, in the hope that God will grant them repentance leading them to a knowledge of the truth,

Hebrews 6:1 NIV — Therefore let us move beyond the elementary teachings about Christ and be taken forward to maturity, not laying again the foundation of repentance from acts that lead to death, and of faith in God,

Hebrews 6:6 NIV — and who have fallen away, to be brought back to repentance. To their loss they are crucifying the Son of God all over again and subjecting him to public disgrace.

2 Peter 3:9 NIV — The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. Instead he is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance.

- Matthew 3:2 And saying, Repent ye: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.
- Matthew 3:8 Bring forth therefore fruits meet for repentance:
- Matthew 3:11 I indeed baptize you with water unto <u>repentance</u>: but he that cometh after me is mightier than I, whose shoes I am not worthy to bear: he shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost, and *with* fire:
- Matthew 4:17 From that time Jesus began to preach, and to say, <u>Repent</u>: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.
- Matthew 9:13 But go ye and learn what *that* meaneth, I will have mercy, and not sacrifice: for I am not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance.
- Matthew 11:20 Then began he to upbraid the cities wherein most of his mighty works were done, because they <u>repented</u> not:
- Matthew 11:21 Woe unto thee, Chorazin! woe unto thee, Bethsaida! for if the mighty works, which were done in you, had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago in sackcloth and ashes.
- Matthew 12:41 The men of Nineveh shall rise in judgment with this generation, and shall condemn it: because they <u>repented</u> at the preaching of Jonas; and, behold, a greater than Jonas *is* here.
- Matthew 21:29 He answered and said, I will not: but afterward he repented, and went.
- Matthew 21:32 For John came unto you in the way of righteousness, and ye believed him not: but the publicans and the harlots believed him: and ye, when ye had seen *it*, repented not afterward, that ye might believe him.
- Matthew 27:3 Then Judas, which had betrayed him, when he saw that he was condemned, <u>repented</u> himself, and brought again the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and elders,
- Mark 1:4 John did baptize in the wilderness, and preach the baptism of <u>repentance</u> for the remission of sins.
- Mark 1:15 And saying, The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand: repent ye, and believe the gospel.
- Mark 2:17 When Jesus heard *it*, he saith unto them, They that are whole have no need of the physician, but they that are sick: I came not to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance.
- Mark 6:12 And they went out, and preached that men should repent.
- Luke 3:3 And he came into all the country about Jordan, preaching the baptism of repentance for the remission of sins;

- Luke 3:8 Bring forth therefore fruits worthy of <u>repentance</u>, and begin not to say within yourselves, We have Abraham to *our* father: for I say unto you, That God is able of these stones to raise up children unto Abraham.
- Luke 5:32 I came not to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance.
- Luke 10:13 Woe unto thee, Chorazin! woe unto thee, Bethsaida! for if the mighty works had been done in Tyre and Sidon, which have been done in you, they had a great while ago repented, sitting in sackcloth and ashes.
- Luke 11:32 The men of Nineve shall rise up in the judgment with this generation, and shall condemn it: for they <u>repented</u> at the preaching of Jonas; and, behold, a greater than Jonas *is* here.
- Luke 13:3 I tell you, Nay: but, except ye <u>repent</u>, ye shall all likewise perish.
- Luke 13:5 I tell you, Nay: but, except ye <u>repent</u>, ye shall all likewise perish.
- Luke 15:7 I say unto you, that likewise joy shall be in heaven over one sinner that repenteth, more than over ninety and nine just persons, which need no repentance.
- Luke 15:10 Likewise, I say unto you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner that repenteth.
- Luke 16:30 And he said, Nay, father Abraham: but if one went unto them from the dead, they will repent.
- Luke 17:3 Take heed to yourselves: If thy brother trespass against thee, rebuke him; and if he <u>repent</u>, forgive him.
- Luke 17:4 And if he trespass against thee seven times in a day, and seven times in a day turn again to thee, saying, I repent; thou shalt forgive him.
- Luke 24:47 And that <u>repentance</u> and remission of sins should be preached in his name among all nations, beginning at Jerusalem.
- Acts 2:38 Then Peter said unto them, <u>Repent</u>, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost.
- Acts 3:19 Repent ye therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, when the times of refreshing shall come from the presence of the Lord;
- Acts 5:31 Him hath God exalted with his right hand *to be* a Prince and a Saviour, for to give <u>repentance</u> to Israel, and forgiveness of sins.
- Acts 8:22 Repent therefore of this thy wickedness, and pray God, if perhaps the thought of thine heart may be forgiven thee.
- Acts 11:18 When they heard these things, they held their peace, and glorified God, saying, Then hath God also to the Gentiles granted <u>repentance</u> unto life.
- Acts 13:24 When John had first preached before his coming the baptism of <u>repentance</u> to all the people of Israel.
- Acts 17:30 And the times of this ignorance God winked at; but now commandeth all men every where to <u>repent</u>:
- Acts 19:4 Then said Paul, John verily baptized with the baptism of <u>repentance</u>, saying unto the people, that they should believe on him which should come after him, that is, on Christ Jesus.
- Acts 20:21 Testifying both to the Jews, and also to the Greeks, <u>repentance</u> toward God, and faith toward our Lord Jesus Christ.
- Acts 26:20 But shewed first unto them of Damascus, and at Jerusalem, and throughout all the coasts of Judaea, and *then* to the Gentiles, that they should <u>repent</u> and turn to God, and do works meet for repentance.
- Romans 2:4 Or despisest thou the riches of his goodness and forbearance and longsuffering; not knowing that the goodness of God leadeth thee to <u>repentance</u>? Romans 11:29 For the gifts and calling of God *are* without repentance.

- 2 Corinthians 7:8 For though I made you sorry with a letter, I do not <u>repent</u>, though I did <u>repent</u>: for I perceive that the same epistle hath made you sorry, though *it were* but for a season.
- 2 Corinthians 7:9 Now I rejoice, not that ye were made sorry, but that ye sorrowed to repentance: for ye were made sorry after a godly manner, that ye might receive damage by us in nothing.
- 2 Corinthians 7:10 For godly sorrow worketh <u>repentance</u> to salvation not to be <u>repented</u> of: but the sorrow of the world worketh death.
- 2 Corinthians 12:21 *And* lest, when I come again, my God will humble me among you, and *that* I shall bewail many which have sinned already, and have not <u>repented</u> of the uncleanness and fornication and lasciviousness which they have committed.
- 2 Timothy 2:25 In meekness instructing those that oppose themselves; if God peradventure will give them <u>repentance</u> to the acknowledging of the truth;
- Hebrews 6:1 ¶ Therefore leaving the principles of the doctrine of Christ, let us go on unto perfection; not laying again the foundation of <u>repentance</u> from dead works, and of faith toward God,
- Hebrews 6:6 If they shall fall away, to renew them again unto <u>repentance</u>; seeing they crucify to themselves the Son of God afresh, and put *him* to an open shame.
- Hebrews 7:21 (For those priests were made without an oath; but this with an oath by him that said unto him, The Lord sware and will not <u>repent</u>, Thou *art* a priest for ever after the order of Melchisedec:)
- Hebrews 12:17 For ye know how that afterward, when he would have inherited the blessing, he was rejected: for he found no place of <u>repentance</u>, though he sought it carefully with tears.
- 2 Peter 3:9 ¶ The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance.
- Revelation 2:5 Remember therefore from whence thou art fallen, and <u>repent</u>, and do the first works; or else I will come unto thee quickly, and will remove thy candlestick out of his place, except thou repent.
- Revelation 2:16 Repent; or else I will come unto thee quickly, and will fight against them with the sword of my mouth.
- Revelation 2:21 And I gave her space to repent of her fornication; and she repented not.
- Revelation 2:22 Behold, I will cast her into a bed, and them that commit adultery with her into great tribulation, except they repent of their deeds.
- Revelation 3:3 Remember therefore how thou hast received and heard, and hold fast, and repent. If therefore thou shalt not watch, I will come on thee as a thief, and thou shalt not know what hour I will come upon thee.
- Revelation 3:19 As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten: be zealous therefore, and repent.
- Revelation 9:20 And the rest of the men which were not killed by these plagues yet repented not of the works of their hands, that they should not worship devils, and idols of gold, and silver, and brass, and stone, and of wood: which neither can see, nor hear, nor walk:
- Revelation 9:21 Neither <u>repented</u> they of their murders, nor of their sorceries, nor of their fornication, nor of their thefts.
- Revelation 16:9 And men were scorched with great heat, and blasphemed the name of God, which hath power over these plagues: and they <u>repented</u> not to give him glory.
- Revelation 16:11 And blasphemed the God of heaven because of their pains and their sores, and <u>repented</u> not of their deeds.
