# Word Studies "Trials and Temptations"

There's always a bit of confusion in the use of the biblical terms trials and temptations. The words are used synonymously of trial such as suffering, or temptation to commit sin. Trials can refer to persecution, or disease, or affliction, or imprisonment, or suffering loss, or enticement to do evil. They mean the same thing. The difference is in the purpose and author of the test, trial, temptation, or trouble.

**Satan** = tempts, trips, torments, <u>to destroy</u> faith **God** = tries, tests, proves, to strengthen faith by fire

#### TRIAL

Job 9:23 If the scourge slay suddenly, he will laugh at the <u>trial</u> of the innocent. Ezekiel 21:13 Because *it is* a <u>trial</u>, and what if *the sword* contemn even the rod? it shall be no *more*, saith the Lord GOD.

2 Corinthians 8:2 How that in a **great <u>trial</u> of affliction** the abundance of their joy and their deep poverty abounded unto the riches of their liberality.

Hebrews 11:36 And others had <u>trial</u> of *cruel* mockings and scourgings, yea, moreover of bonds and imprisonment:
